On 11th November, 1929, I saw a Bustard (Eurodotis australis) between Onetree Hill and Smithfield. On 22nd November a nest of the White-winged Triller (Lalage tricolor) was noted for the first time at Onetree Hill. A nest of the Common Bronzewing (Phaps chalcoptera) has been used, presumably by the same bird, for three consecutive years. nest of the Red-backed Parrot (Psephotus haematonotus) was found containing seven eggs. Chestnut-eared (Taeniopugia castanotis) are more plentiful than in any other year, and nesting freely. Banded Plovers (Zonifer tricolor) I had seven nests under observation: four were common. contained four eggs each and three three eggs each. At Uraidla, on 26th November, I saw a pair of Spotted Quail-Thrushes (Cinclosoma punctatum) with a young bird just out of the nest. Later on I came across another Spotted Quail-Thrush and a Ground-Thrush (Oreocincla lunulata).
