My first and most important note is the Blue-winged Parrot (Neophema chrysostoma). A small party of seven was seen on 15th September a mile south of Balgowan. attracted my attention, as it is faster than our common Parrot, the Mulga (Psephotus varius). I followed them up, and was able to get within a few yards and observe them closely through the field-glasses for half an hour. The Banded Plovers (Zonifer *tricolor*) are nesting freely this year. The first nest was found on 19th June. It then contained two eggs; the third egg was laid on 21st, and the fourth on 23rd June. Up to date I have found five nests, the last one to-day with four eggs, and the bird was flushed off the nest. Last year I had eight nests under observation at the one time; a rather interesting one was found on 8/9/28, when it contained six eggs with four birds in atten-The Budgerygahs (Melopsittacus undulatus) were here last season in thousands, from 24th September, 1928, to 4th March, 1929, and nested freely in the mallee. Crimson Chats (Epthianura tricolor) were down, and nested here last year.
