
Notes About Cuckoos.

Notes About Cuckoos.

Bronze-Cuckoo, *Chalcites basalis*, out of the nest. At Port Gawler on 7th December, 1935, a Singing Honeyeater was with a young Pallid Cuckoo, out of the nest and able to fly. At Beaumont on 23rd November a Pallid Cuckoo was heard calling; and on 16th December, 1935, two Scarlet Robins were feeding a young Horsfield Bronze-Cuckoo. Near Fulham on 27th December, 1935, a young Pallid Cuckoo, out of the nest, was being fed by a pair of Singing Honeyeaters.
