A bird which was identified as a female Rufous Whistler (Pachycephala rufiventris) was obtained on 24th July, 1937. The bird was fairly shy and was found in a elump of black oak and broombush on the Willowie Plain in the company of the following species:—White-fronted Chat (Epthianura albifrons), Crimson Chat (E. tricolor), Orange Chat (E. aurifrons), Blueand-white Wren (Malurus cyanotus), Masked Wood-Swallow

(Artamus personatus), Black-faced Wood-Swallow, (A. melanops), Grey-backed Silvereye (Zosterops halmaturinā) and Singing Honeyeater (Meliphaga virescens).
