26th April, 1937.—At 7.30 a.m. on this date six White Ibis (*Threskiornis molucca*) flew over the sewage farm, Islington, in a south-easterly direction; after they had passed over four of the birds turned round, circled, and came back. They landed in fairly high grass which was in water.

6th June, 1937.—In the Torrens Gorge four Wedge-tailed Eagles (*Uroaetus audax*) were seen soaring over the hills. We were told that a bird had been shot there six months ago. Two Eagles were seen in the same locality on 19th January, 1936.

4th July, 1937.—Two Black-shouldered Kites (*Elanus axillaris*) and a Collared Sparrowhawk (*Accipiter cirrocephalus*) were roosting near to each other in adjacent trees at Islington.

11th September, 1937.—Eleven male Purple-backed Wrens (*Malurus assimilis*) were observed and a Scrub Robin (*Drymodes brunneopygia*) was heard at Long Plains.
