BIRD NOTES

ARCTIC TERN RECORD—On November 12, 1971, the skeleton of a beachwashed Arctic Tern Sterna paradisea was found at Middleton. Condon 1969 (A Handlist of the Birds of South Australia) gives only one previous record for South Australia (Brighton 1923).

The Middleton specimen is almost in eclipse plumage, having a mottled forehead and blackish red bill. The legs are still red, not black as in birds that have completed the transition. Other details are:— Culmen; approx. 32 mm. Wing; 260 mm. (tip damaged). The first primary of the right wing and the second primary of both wings show only a narrow dark margin inside the white feather shaft. The first primary of the left wing was missing. Tarsus; 16 mm. Tail; left side of the forked tail 170 mm. (not complete); the outer web of the long retrices is dark grey.—R. D. ROBINSON.
