Platycercus icterotis (?).—Three birds in a cage, now about 10 months old, probably, 60 miles south of Coolgardie, on the Kurrawang woodline. They had been obtained from a fallen tree in the neighbourhood. These Parrots were known, but scarce, and found round the great granite outcrops in summertime. Apparently a male and two females, in immature plumage. Male apparently only about $8\frac{1}{4}$ inches long (pocket ruler held up to measure), extensive pale yellow face patch (less vivid than in the Museum species of *P. icterotis*). Slightly blue under the chin; greenish tint on the red of the head; neck red; breast
