Steering Committee Report, 17th Nov.

Pageant. Our projected float has been cancelled, due to lack of interest by members. Instead, we propose that whoever is interested should walk together, perhaps with binoculars, bird-lists, advertising board, bird costumes - whatever. Please come and let us make our presence felt!

Meeting and Outing Times. In order to simplify people's time-tabling, we would like to have these on regulardays of the month. Our meeting remain on the second Friday of odd months. Outings Reports.

Tues, Oct 31st, Mt Compass Boardwalk.

A fine cool morning, in contrast with our last attempt! Attendance was disappointing, but this may have helped the birdwatching from the confines of a narrow boardwalk. The Southern Emu-wren eluded us, but we were amazed to record 28 species including: Cockatiel, Elegant Parrot, Yellow-tailed Black Cockatoo and Cattle Egret. There were plenty of Superb Fairy Wrens, also Little Grassbird, Brown Falcon, Sulphur-crested Cockatoo and Goldfinch for good measure. The morning was concluded at Coles Crossing Rd (off Nankita Rd) where Kit eyeballed a big, recently-fed black snake for twenty minutes! The birds were around, but not obvious, although the Crescent Honeyeaters sat in the branches over us as we drank our coffee and summed up. A very pleasant and rewarding morning

Sun, Nov 12th, Hindmarsh Island Wader Outing.

As a follow-up to his talk on Friday night, David Close and nine members covered the southern shore and Bird Island from the shore and the water using the services of Jack Miller and his punt. The weather was ideal, and although bird numbers generally were not great, the variety exceeded expectations, with 37 species recorded. Migratory waders included the more common Greenshank, Sharp-tailed Sandpiper and Rednecked Stint, together with Eastern Curlew, Bar-tailed Godwit, Red Knot, Curlew-Sandpiper and Sanderling (usually found on the ocean beach). Other sightings of note were Black-faced Cormorant and Fairy Terns. Summing-up over coffee on Jack Miller's balcony concluded a great morning.

Other Sightings.

Azure Kingfisher (mid-September, on river), Fan-tailed Cuckoo (Oct, Goolwa), Pallid Cuckoo (Beach Road), Swans nesting on Mundoo and Ewe Island, Ravens taking young or eggs on Hindmarsh Island, two Hooded Dotterels at Waitpinga (Nov). (Apologies for not taking fuller notes - Pam).
