Outings Reports

Friday, 7th April, Hindmarsh Island.

There was a strong, cool southerly with squalls, not a good day for birds or birdwatchers; migratory waders, a major objective, had all disapppeared. Nevertheless, a final count of 30 included a swan guarding a nest, a group of over thirty Masked Lapwings, and a Superb Fairy Wren sighted while doing the bird count at the home of Kate Bruce. The few survivors enjoyed the outing and the get-together afterwards

Thursday, 27th April, Winery Rd, Currency Creek.

A sunny morning interspersed among the weeks of damp weather made for a very pleasant outing. Ten people, including three new faces, saw 36 species including a flock of Zebra Finches, a group of Red-browed Finches, Dusky Woodswallows, Golden Whistler, all the Lorikeets, Wrens, Straw-necked Ibis, a Brown Falcon, and Silvereyes everywhere. The highlight was the conspicuous presence of Mistletoe birds. All species were seen from the road, although some people followed inside the railway reserve. Bruce and Judith had also seen an additional 8 species the preceding week making this a good, easy birdwatching location.

Other Sightings Reported by Members: Black-chinned Honeyeaters, White-faced Storm Petrel (beach-washed, Victor Harbor), Sooty Oystercatchers (Goolwa), Beautiful Firetail (Hindmarsh Valley), Mistletoe Birds (Goolwa Beach area), Blackfaced Cuckoo-shrike, Fan-tailed Cuckoo, Brown Falcon (Yundi), and Shrike Thrushes.
