Brian showed photos of some of the birds and animals seen at Savegre Mountain Lodge, Rancho Naturalista, La Selva Research Station, Hotel Villa Lapas, Tarcoles River, Carara National Park, Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve and the capital San José.
