

Bird Notes.

The White-fronted Honeyeaters (*Gliciphila albifrons*), which had been recorded for the first time at Ambleside on 20th October, 1928, in the trees at the edge of a big clearing, were there in fair numbers on 9th November, and have evidently nested as a parent bird was seen feeding two fully-fledged young, who were very inquisitive and flew quite close to me. A small flock of Cockatoo-Parrots (*Leptolophus hollandicus*) came here in October, but remained for a few days only. To my list of the species of birds in the Ambleside district (see "S.A. Ornithologist," Vol. VIII, pp. 343-4) the two above-named have to be added, as well as White-browed Scrub-Wren (*Sericornis frontalis*); White-browed Wood-Swallow (*Artamus superciliosus*); and Yellow-faced Honeyeater (*Meliphaga chrysops*). These bring the total number of species to 87.
