

Bird Notes.

11.15 a.m., 28/9/28.—A flock of Masked Wood-Swallows (*Artamus personatus*) circled overhead for a few minutes, then flew southwards. A strong north-west gale, with dust, was then blowing. I did not see any White-browed Wood-Swallows (*A. superciliosus*) with them.

18/10/1928.—I saw one Yellow-tailed Black Cockatoo (*Calyptorhynchus funereus*) flying high in a south-westerly direction and calling loudly at 6.50 a.m.
