Since my previous notes were published I have seen a Barn Owl (*Tyto alba*) near Sutherlands, and an Elegant Parrot (*Neophema elegans*) has been taken at Bower. The Chestnut-crowned Babbler (*Pomatostomus ruficeps*) has been seen only north and east of Sutherlands, whilst the White-browed species (*P. superciliosus*) is distributed over the whole district. Many White-naped Honeyeaters (*Melithreptus lunatus*) were seen near Halfway House, Annadale, and a bird was secured near Sutherlands. Several Regent Honeyeaters (*Zanthomiza phrygia*) have been reported to me, and I was shown a specimen from near Sutherlands. Yellow-winged Honeyeaters (*Meliornis novae-hollandiae*) have been seen on several occasions. When working the scrub near Halfway House, Annadale, the Yellow-throated Miner (*Myzantha flavigula*) only was seen, whilst on a previous visit the Noisy Miner (*M. melanocephala*) was the dominant form.
