On 12th September, 1929, five Bare-eyed Cockatoos (*Kakatoe sanguinea*) were seen flying over King's Park.

On 4th November, 1929, at Moolawatana, near Lake Frome, a nest of the Black-faced Wood-Swallow (*Artamus melanops*) with four eggs was found. There were very few birds about.

Those seen were two Whistlers, a Butcher-Bird, 50 Crows, and 200 Galahs.
