On 30th January, 1930, Miss Jocelyn Ray brought me a Rail which had been found by her in their garden at Glen Osmond. It had a broken wing, and was identified by Dr. Morgan as a young Lewin Water-Rail (*Rallus pectoralis*).

The bird was handed to Mr. S. Harvey, the aviculturist, with the hope that he might be able to rear it; however, it died, and was handed to the South Australian Museum. It proved, on dissection, to be a female.
