*Bird Notes.*

On 6th July, 1930, I noted a pair of Galahs (*Kakatoe roseicapilla*) about a mile east of Aldinga. On 7th July a pair was seen about two miles south of Normanville. The former place is about 30 miles, and the latter 50 miles, south of Adelaide. Mr. Lockhart Jack, who has just returned from a trip to about 200 miles north-west of Tarcoola, stated that the country looks exceptionally well. The Brown Songlark (*Cinclorhamphus cruralis*) was the commonest bird. Crimson Chats (*Epthianura tricolor*) were in greater numbers than the Orange species (*E. aurifrons*), and wherever the motor-car was stopped at least a dozen of the former were soon about.
