

Some Additions to the South Australian Museum.

Puffinus carneipes, Fleshy-footed Shearwater.—A bird of this species was found by Miss Joan Cleland at Encounter Bay, S.A., on 16th April, 1930.

Turnix pyrrhothorax, Red-chested Quail, ♀.—This bird was shot by Mr. H. R. Telford at Morphett Vale on 15th May, 1930. In going through the bag at the end of the day Mr. Ernest Whittington, who was one of the party, noticed this bird, and brought it in for verification. This is the third record of the species for South Australia. Dr. W. T. Angove obtained a ♀ at Teatree Gully on 18th December, 1904, and Mr. B. Marshall got one at Yankalilla in January, 1922.

Kakatoe roseicapilla (Galah).—Two were sent in from Buckland Park, Two Wells, S.A., on 4th July, 1930—♂, total length, 37 cm.; spread of wings, 78 cm.; weight, 1 lb. $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. Crop contained wheat. ♀, total length, 36 cm.; spread, 76 cm.; weight, 1 lb. Stomach and crop contained triturated seeds—wheat (?). (Poisoned wheat was laid.)
