

*Bird Notes.*

Noted at Buckland Park, Two Wells, on 21st December, 1930:—Many young White-headed Stilts (*Himantopus leucocephalus*); a flock (about 30) of Curlew Sandpipers (*Erolia testacea*); many Sharp-tailed Sandpipers (*E. acuminata*); no Red-necked Stints (*E. ruficollis*); 15 Greenshanks (*Tringa nebularia*); many Pied Cormorants (*Phalacrocorax varius*) and Little Pied Cormorants (*Microcarbo melanoleucus*); about 200 Black Swans (*Chenopsis atrata*).

On the seabeach at Port Gawler there was a flock of 80 Eastern Curlews (*Numenius cyanopus*).

In a letter dated 2nd March, 1931, Mr. N. T. Gurr, manager of Clifton Hills Station, on the River Diamantina, stated that there was a good number of the Flock-Pigeons (*Histriophaps histrionica*) about there at the time of writing.
