*Bird Notes.*

Welcome Swallow (*Hirundo neoxena*).—Mr. E. H. Ising reported on 8th January, 1932, that thousands of these swallows were about the railway workshops at Islington at 9.40 a.m. Some birds were flying around, but the great majority were sitting on the wires—power, telephone and telegraph. The birds remained about the workshops until 1 p.m.

Mr. George Dempster reported that on 27th February, 1932, whilst motoring between Wellington and Meningie, between 3 and 4 p.m., he saw some thousands in all of Welcome Swallows, sitting on the telegraph and fence wires over a distance of half a mile.
