

*Bird Notes.*

Quail.—Mr. T. G. Souter, near Maitland, Yorke's Peninsula, states that:—"On 17th March, 1932, while burning stubble, I came across a Stubble Quail (*Coturnix pectoralis*) with five young only a day or two out of the nest. Both the Stubble Quail and Little Quail (*Turnix velox*) are very plentiful here this year, and during the very hot weather you could almost pick them up around the wheat heaps. I have never seen so many here, and they are still very plentiful."
