

*Bird Notes.*

Cotton.—On 25th March he observed a flock of 26 Galahs near Brentwood, south of Ardrossan, Yorke's Peninsula, and 12 Emus (*Dromaius novae-hollandiae*) between Gleeson's Landing and Pondalowie Bay, Yorke's Peninsula. On 7th April he watched about 40 Marsh Terns (*Chlidonias leucopareia*) following the track of churned water caused by the screw of the "milk boat" which travels between Murray Bridge and Wellington. The Terns made their appearance at Tailam Bend and followed the boat to Wellington. They ranged over a distance of 300/400 yards, with a width of 10 feet, behind the boat and kept diving down for fish. They followed the boat between 3.30 and 5 p.m., and immediately on its stoppage near Wellington the birds left. The driver of the boat said this

was a common occurrence. On 15th April, while passing Monarto, where the two Galahs mentioned some time ago were frequently seen, a flock of seven was noticed about 4 p.m.
