15th September, 1932.—This morning two adult Little Wattle-Birds (*Anthochaera chrysoptera*) with a young bird were eating the fruit in a loquat tree in the garden. An Indian Turtle Dove (*Streptopelia suratensis*) drove them away several times. The

young bird had a call like that of a Cockatiel (*Leptolophus hollandicus*).

28th October, 1932. — A Reed-Warbler (*Acrocephalus australis*) was singing from some bulrushes at a little spring in the grounds of the Teachers' College, Adelaide.

31st October, 1932.—At the Camden Swamp were seen:— One Snipe (*Capella hardwicki*), one Red-necked Stint (*Erolia ruficollis*), with a small flock of Red-capped Dotterels (*Charadrius ruficapillus*), and a number of Sharp-tailed Sandpipers (*Erolia acuminata*).

Nests.—A Blue Bald Coot (*Porphyrio melanotus*) with seven eggs; Little Crake (*Porzana pusilla*), six nests with five eggs each; 20/30 nests without eggs. Two birds were seen to flush off nests containing eggs.
