*Bird Notes.*

25/12/1932.—While passing through Monarto South at 12 noon a flock of some 50 or 60 Shell Parrots (*Melopsittacus undulatus*) were seen, and on New Year's Day three flocks of those birds were near Tailern Bend.

5/3/1933.—Fifty White Ibis (*Threskiornis molucca*) and 12 Straw-necked Ibis (*T. spinicollis*) were observed on the swamps near Tailern Bend.

11/3/1933.—Between Adelaide and Paskeville, about 7 a.m., four lots (2, 4, 2, 3) of Galahs (*Kakatoe roseicapilla*) were passed. At 3 p.m. at Wallaroo four Nankeen Kestrels (*Falco cenchroides*) were flying over the big mine-dump. Odd ones to the number of a dozen were seen at various places en route from Adelaide. At 4 p.m., between Wallaroo Mines and Melton, Yorke's Peninsula, a Whistling Eagle (*Haliastur sphenurus*) was noted.
