*Bird Notes.*

Over last week end Mr. Pearce and I made a trip to Warrakimbo Creek, and noted the following species:—

Black Falcons (*Falco subniger*).—A pair with a nest containing three eggs. Fork-tailed Kites (*Milvus migrans*).—Two pairs. A nest contained one egg. Whistling Eagles (*Haliastur sphenurus*).—A dozen pairs. Spotted Harriers (*Circus assimilis*).—Two pairs—one pair with three young on the wing. Little Corellas (*Kakatoe sanguinea*).—Were in numbers, but only a pair found nesting. Cockatiels (*Leptolophus hollandicus*).—In fair numbers, and just getting busy nesting. Elegant Parrots (*Neophema elegans*).—A fair number seen, and some young ones on the wing. Crimson Chats (*Epthianura tricolor*).—Two nests were found at Yadlamalka.
