In January, 1933, at Encounter Bay, were noted:—A Spotted Crake (*Porzana fluminea*), a Red-kneed Dotterel (*Erythrogonyx cinctus*), and a White-headed Stilt (*Himantopus leucocephalus*).

A Fleshy-footed Shearwater (*Puffinus carneipes*) was picked up dead. 17th January; ♀; total length, 18 inches; span of wings, 42½ inches; bill, flesh colour, tip darker; feet, pale flesh colour.

White-breasted Cormorant (*Phalacrocorax fuscescens*).—19th January; ♀; total length, 25½ inches; span of wings, 43 inches; weight, 3½ lb.; iris, malachite green; bill, blackish; pharynx,

greyish flesh; feet, blackish; stomach contents: six small weed fish (*Petraites roseus*); nematodes free in peritoneal cavity and free in stomach (? from the fish).

On 6th March, 1933, a small flock of White-fronted Chats
(*Epthianura albifrons*) was seen on the Jubilee Oval, Adelaide.
