At Deep Creek, Lake Alexandrina, on 13th February, 1934. Red-necked Stints (*Erolia ruficollis*) were very plentiful. Mountain Duck (*Casarca tadornoides*) were plentiful; a few Black Duck (*Anas superciliosa*) and some Blue-winged Shovelers (*Spatula rhynchotis*) were seen, but no Teal (*Querquedula*) were about. Three Eastern Curlews (*Numenius cyanopus*) and 27 Cape Barren Geese (*Cereopsis novae-hollandiae*) were also noted.

Bird Notes.

Next day, at another part of Deep Creek, were observed 13 Cape Barren Geese, 47 Red-necked Avocets (*Recurvirostra novae-hollandiae*) in one flock, besides others flying about, two Greenshanks (*Tringa nebularia*), and a Black-shouldered Kite (*Elanus axillaris*). Red-necked Stints were again very plentiful, and a few Sharp-tailed Sandpipers (*Erolia acuminata*) were in their company.
