

*Bird Notes.*

*Zanthomiza phrygia* (Regent Honeyeater).—In the Waterfall Gully, National Park, Belair, on 11th November, 1934, a nest of this species was built thirty feet from the ground in a gumtree. A bird flew to the nest.

At 1 p.m. on 17th April, 1934, a flock of twenty-three Galahs (*Kakatoe roseicapilla*) flew over the Adelaide University. A pair of Flame Robins (*Petroica phoenicea*) was seen on 25th April, 1934, near Eden Valley.
