Unusual Actions of a Magpie-Lark (*Grallina cyanoleuca*). By

Whilst walking along Fisher Street, after crossing Kent Terrace, Norwood, early on the morning of 17th October, 1934, I was surprised by a sudden attack of a "Murray Magpie." Firstly it flew very smartly against my face and eye-glasses, and then went up into a tree, from which it suddenly returned, giving my hat a smart smack, and as I continued walking it flew alongside me for a few yards, uttering loud threatening calls. Finally the bird disappeared in the trees nearby, and, although I have passed the place several times since, I have not seen the bird again. Doubtless there is a nest in one of the trees, but so far I have not been able to discover it.
