*Bird Notes.*

A Brush Bronzewing (*Phaps elegans*) was seen at Mount Lofty during the week ending 21st April, 1934. On 9th October, 1934, four Eastern Rosellas (*Platycercus eximius*) were noted at Coromandel Valley, and at Clarendon on 15th November, 1934, a nest of this species in a hollow fence-post contained three young about a week old. On 17th October, 1934, at Mount Lofty, a nest of a Golden Whistler (*Pachycephala pectoralis*) was built seven feet up in a stringy-bark sapling. As the nest could be seen through it was thought to be an old one, and was pulled down, when it was found to have a lining of fresh green stuff. The nest was patched up and replaced. The bird did not seem to have been affected by the interference, as on 1st November the nest contained two eggs of a Golden Whistler.

*Bird Notes.*

On 25th October, 1934, in the reeds, etc., on the Finnis River, one-and-a-half miles south of Finnis township, a number of Reed Warblers (*Acrocephalus australis*) and Little Grassbirds (*Megalurus gramineus*) were calling. On 4th November, 1934, three Orange-breasted Parrots (*Neophema chrysogaster*) were seen about the old spot—near Karatta House, Robe—for four days in all. On 10th November six Golden Plovers (*Pluvialis dominicus*) were noted at Boatswain Point, Robe. On 11th November four Greenshanks (*Tringa nebularia*) a few Red-necked Stints (*Erolia ruficollis*), and many Sharp-tailed Sandpipers (*Erolia acuminata*) were seen along the Coorong in the sanctuary near Wood's Well.
