Whilst dredging on 7th July, 1934, off the sandspit three miles out from Black Point, twelve miles below Ardrossan, eastern coast of Yorke Peninsula, a cement pillar, ten to fifteen

feet in height, was passed. On the top of the pillar was a nest of a Cormorant sp. The fisherman in charge of the boat said that the Cormorants had built there for five or six years to his knowledge, and probably longer. Previously a wooden pile stood there, and the birds had used that as a nesting site. Two Pelicans (*Pelecanus conspicillatus*) were seen on the shore end of the above-mentioned spit on the same day.
