

*Bird Notes.*

On 28th June, 1934, a strange bird was seen in the garden in the morning. It was identified on its appearance on 9th July as a ♀ Satin Bower Bird, *Ptilonorhynchus violaceus*, and was evidently one of the two females which had escaped from the Adelaide Zoo. On the 6th July a ♂ Mistletoe Bird, *Dicaeum hirundinaceum*, was noticed in the pomegranate tree, and next day a flock of twelve Black-faced Cuckoo-Shrikes (*Coracina novae-hollandiae*) passed over flying due north.
