10th January, 1934. — *Meliphaga virescens*, Singing Honey-eater eating the berries of *Myoporum insulare*, Blue-berry Tree or Native Juniper.

22nd May, 1934. — Both White-backed and Black-backed Magpies (*Gymnorhina hypoleuca* and *G. tibicen*) were seen at Wanbi on the Alawoona railway line, and a White-backed Magpie at Naturi further south. *Strepera melanoptera*, Black-winged Currawong, was observed at Mindarie on the same line.

27th August, 1934. — A White-backed Magpie was seen at Hawker, S.A.

1st December, 1934. — On this (Saturday) morning three Silver Gulls (*Larus novae-hollandiae*) were flying around Victoria Square, Adelaide, beside the Post Office clock. There was a fresh south-westerly wind, and the day before gales in Victoria.

27th January, 1935. — On the top of Mount Noorat near Terang, Victoria, a Nankeen Kestrel (*Falco cenchroides*) hovered in one spot while 18 was slowly counted. Probably this was for 15 seconds at least.

27th February, 1935. — Saw a Pallid Cuckoo (*Cuculus pallidus*) ? on a telegraph wire near Willunga, S.A. At Beaumont, earlier in February, I saw a Cuckoo (sp.).

8th March, 1935. — At 7.45 a.m. 17 Crows (*Corvus sp.*), in a straggling band and cawing, flew east of north at Beaumont.

10th March, 1935. — At 7.30 a.m. 20 Red Wattle-Birds (*Anthochaera carunculata*) flew in a scattered flock north-easterly at Beaumont. At 8.45 a.m. 24 Red Wattle-Birds, possibly the same flock, were moving north-easterly near the East End Market, Adelaide.
