*Bird Notes.*

Birds Noted on Yorke Peninsula in September, 1935. By B. C. Cotton.

11/9/1935.—At Black Point, Gulf St. Vincent, an Albatross was found high up on the beach. The head was preserved=*Diomedea chlororhyncha*, Yellow-nosed Albatross. 12/9/1935.—At Port Moorowie, Investigator Strait, a dead black-and-white Petrel was found. The head was preserved=*Daption capense*, Cape Petrel.

*Lobibyx novae-hollandiae*, Spur-winged Plover.—A nest was found behind a small stone. It contained three eggs, and the birds attacked us whilst we were near the nest. Some sheep were standing near the nesting site.

13/9/1935, *Strepera* sp., Currawong.—A bird was seen at Corny Point, Spencer's Gulf, and at Leven's, near Hardwicke Bay.

14/9/1935, *Ocyphaps lophotes*, Crested Pigeon.—Was seen fairly commonly at Corny Point. According to Mr. Walter Klem, the species is a recent arrival there.

15/9/1935, *Kakatoe roseicapilla*, Galah.—Two birds were seen at Dairy Station, near Corny Point. I recorded the species previously from Brentwood, Y.P.
