Cape Barren Goose *Cereopsis novae-hollandiae*.

26th March, 1935.—Miss V. Pearce, of "Kindaruar," Milang, counted 153 birds in the paddocks near the homestead, fifty at the back of the homestead. Geese returned about the second week of November, 1935, when there were from 200 to 300 in the Reedy Point sanctuary, whilst a good number were in the wheat stubble in the paddocks behind the homestead. On 19th March, 1936, these geese were in hundreds in stubble, a long distance from the water.

Dr. A. S. Randell saw a flock of forty birds on 14th February, 1935, on Lake Alexandrina, flying down the Tauwitchenie Channel over Tauwitchenie Island, and away towards Pelican Point at the entrance of the Coorong. Over the same channel on 31st December, 1935, a flock of twenty-eight geese were seen flying.
