

At Reeve's Plains on 12th July two Whistling Eagles (*Haliaeetus sphenurus*) were attacked by two *Corvus* sp. A White-backed Swallow (*Cheramoeca leucosterna*) was seen and about eighty Zebra Finches (*Taeniopygia castanotis*) were counted in one boxthorn bush.

At North Adelaide on 17th July two Brown-headed Honeyeaters (*Melithreptus brevirostris*) were in pepper-trees (*Schinus*); and on 31st July a flock of Black-faced Cuckoo-Shrikes (*Coracina novae-hollandiae*) was noted.

At the Grange swamps on 1st August three Spotted Scrub-Wrens (*Sericornis maculatus*) and two Little Grassbirds (*Megalurus gramineus*) were observed. Two nests of the White-fronted Chat were found in the samphire, one with three eggs, which looked heavily incubated, and the other was not completed.

On 2nd August (with R. F. Brown) at half-a-mile north of Gepp's Cross a nest of a Crow (*Corvus ceciliae*) contained three young; two of them could fly and the other, strange to say, had white down. Near Bolivar a ♀ White-fronted Chat was flushed from a nest in samphire containing three eggs, and in the mangroves were heard a Little Grassbird and several Spotted Scrub-Wrens.
