29th April, 1936.—He had seen that day two Regent Honey-eaters (*Zanthoniza phrygia*) on his property.

28th June, 1936.—The Red-Wattle Bird (*Anthochaera carunculata*) nested in a rose bush about six feet high. On 19th

June there was one egg in the nest, but on the 22nd the nest was empty, and a Red Wattle-Bird, presumably the female, was about the spot.

24th September, 1936.—Galah, *Kakatoe roseicapilla*. A flock of thirty-five birds was seen on 1st August, 1936. No Cuckoos have been noted as yet for this season.

Black-faced Cuckoo-Shrike, *Coracina novae-hollandiae*.—A pair is breeding here, and now have young in the nest. This is the first record of this species nesting here.

Pardalote, *Pardalotus* sp.—A nest has been built in a crack in the stone wall of a house in Burnside—for the third year in succession.

Diamond Firetail, *Zonaeginthus guttatus*.—A pair is thought to be breeding, but the nest has not yet been found. If this be so, it is the first record here.
