

Cercopsis novaehollandiae, Cape Barren Goose.

In May, 1936, only a stray Cape Barren Goose was to be seen on "Kindaruar," opposite Reedy Point sanctuary, near Milang. On 11th June, 1936, a few birds were there. (J. E. Pearce).

At Sellick's Beach from 7th to 11th September, 1936, the weather was cloudy and there were strong winds with scattered showers. On 11th at 8.35 p.m. a number of Cape Barren Geese flew in from the south and settled in the swamp (salt lake on map, but now fresh) and on 12th there were seven Geese on the Beach opposite the swamp early in the morning. A local resident stated that a dozen birds were there later in the day. (H. M. Hale).

Three Cape Barren Geese were observed on the Happy Valley Reservoir Reserve from 1st to 3rd November, 1936. (C. Pearce).

On 4th December, 1936, six Cape Barren Geese flew from stubble land towards Reedy Point, which is $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Milang. (L. E. Roake).
