12/4/1937.—More than fifty Galahs (*Kakatoe roseicapilla*) flew over Beaumont about 8 a.m. (On 22/2/1936 two of this species were seen in the Adelaide Park Lands.)

17/9/1936.—A Willie Wagtail (*Rhipidura leucophrys*) was seen with a dragon-fly in its bill.

19/5/1937.—Two Silver Gulls (*Larus novae-hollandiae*) were seen in Pirie Street and several in Hindmarsh Square, in the City of Adelaide.

20/5/1937.—The first Blackbird (*Turdus merula*) was heard singing about the River Torrens near the University, Adelaide.
