

### Cuckoos—1937 Notes.

*Cuculus pallidus*, Pallid Cuckoo.—A male was seen about 12 noon on 12th May on the South Road, near the turn-off to Port Noarlunga. (H. T. Condon).

*Cacomantis flabelliformis*, Fan-tailed Cuckoo.—One was seen in the Waite Agricultural Research Institute property, Mitcham, feeding on caterpillars on the wild-cotton bushes on 1st May in the late afternoon. (H. Wade).

One was heard between 2 and 3 p.m. on 9th May, and another bird was heard from 1.15 to 1.29 p.m. on 15th May at Netherby, Mitcham. (J. Sutton).

One was seen at Firle on a fence eating a hairy caterpillar on 25th May. (Master L. Rowe).

One flew across the backyard at Glen Osmond at 4.30 p.m. on 20th June. (F. E. Parsons).

*Chalcites basalis*, Horsfield Bronze Cuckoo.—Two birds were seen and heard on 16th May two-and-a-half miles east of Chapman's Bore, which is between Murray Bridge and Wynarka. (H. T. Condon).

A bird was heard at Netherby, Mitcham, on 21st. 25th. 29th. and 30th June. (J. Sutton).
