A bird which was identified as a female Rufous Whistler (*Pachycephala rufiventris*) was obtained on 24th July, 1937. The bird was fairly shy and was found in a clump of black oak and broombush on the Willowie Plain in the company of the following species:—White-fronted Chat (*Epthianura albifrons*), Crimson Chat (*E. tricolor*), Orange Chat (*E. aurifrons*), Blue-and-white Wren (*Malurus cyanotus*), Masked Wood-Swallow

(*Artamus personatus*), Black-faced Wood-Swallow, (*A. melanops*), Grey-backed Silvereye (*Zosterops halmaturinā*) and Singing Honeyeater (*Meliphaga virescens*).
