

Cuckoos, 1938.

Cacomantis flabelliformis, Fan-tailed Cuckoo.

H. A. Jarman saw two birds on the 2nd May and again on the 5th May at Waterfall Gully, Burnside.

F. E. Parsons, at Glen Osmond, a bird was seen, but did not call, from 10th May to 10th June.

Chalcites basalis, Horsfield Bronze-Cuckoo.

H. A. Jarman. 5th May.—A bird was seen along Brownhill Creek, Mitcham.

F. E. Parsons, at Glen Osmond, a bird was seen from 10th May to 10th June. He also observed a bird at Kingston, S.E., on 29th June.

H. Wade.—On 8th July a bird was heard in Urrbrae, Mitcham, in the afternoon.

Oscar Symon.—On 14th July a bird called at 1.20 a.m. and for twenty minutes at five miles south-west of Delamere. The calls were two or three "seeyou" and a number of short

“sireerer”—the impression made was that of a bird learning to call. At 8.40 a.m. a bird called over a period of half-an-hour and was followed to three miles north of Delamere.

Cuculus pallidus, Pallid Cuckoo.

H. T. Condon heard a bird calling at the back of the S.A. Museum, City, at 4.15 p.m. on 8th July and at 10 a.m. on 9th July.
