Whilst travelling by motor-car on 4th August, 1938, between 5.30 and 6. p.m. from Mount Eba Station to Bon Bon Station, five Sharp-tailed Sandpipers (*Erolia acuminata*) (three birds, then a pair) flew up from the road to a patch of gravel some fifty yards off in a south-easterly direction. The place was approximately 370 miles from Adelaide, and 200 miles from Port Augusta, N.W. by N., in a direct line. The nearest water was five miles distant.
