

BIRD NOTES**BIRDS AT ALDGATE**

The following birds were seen in the vicinity of Cox's Creek, two miles south of Aldgate, on October 11, 1947. Scarlet Robin (*Petroica multicolor*) seen on numerous occasions. One nest with young was observed near our shack. Flame Robin (*Petroica phoenicea*).—Two males seen at 5 to 8 yards. Eastern Spinebill (*Acanthorhynchus tenuirostris*).—Frequently heard calling and seven birds observed during the day. Restless Flycatcher (*Seisura inquieta*).—Several were heard and seen in growth bordering the creek. Willie Wagtail (*Rhipidura leucophrys*).—One nest built in an Acacia, 4 feet from ground, close to shack. Grey Shrike Thrush (*Colluricincla harmonica*).—Seen and heard. One nest observed near shack. Yellow-winged Honeyeater (*Meliornis novae-hollandiae*).—Numerous. Three nests seen, one with two eggs. White-naped Honeyeater (*Melithreptus lunatus*).—Several heard and observed in the scrub. Pallid Cuckoo (*Cuculus pallidus*).—One heard on October 13, 1947, on the road to Aldgate.
