Red-tailed Black Cockatoo (*Calyptorhynchus banksi*).—From February 3 to March 10, 1948, a flock of twenty-one was observed feeding in various places along the Caves Range, where their principal food appeared to be the seed of Banksias and some bulbous roots.

Black Swan (*Chenopsis atrata*).—During the past twelve months in this district, which period has been wetter than average, Swans have bred almost continuously. On 5/4/1947, a clutch of fresh eggs was seen on a swamp at Joanna, and from then on until the present time young birds in various stages of growth could always be seen on the same water. On 17/4/1947, there was one clutch of small young and another lot about half grown.—A. R. Attiwill.
