

Wedge-tailed Eagle (*Uroaetus audax*).—  
Five birds seen flying and later settled near  
the Brighton Cement Works on May 29,  
1950.—E. S. Paterson. On the Trans-  
continental Line on September 22, 1950,  
coming from Kalgoorlie, between Hughes  
and Cook, in the middle of the Nullarbor  
Plain at about 8 a.m., a single Wedge-tailed  
Eagle and then a pair were seen scouting,  
evidently for rabbits. The nearest timber  
must have been about 100 miles to the  
east, 290 miles to the west, and 60 miles to  
the north, and the Bight would be about 90  
miles south. At Cook, Welcome Swallows  
were flying near the buildings.—J. B. Cle-  
land. A bird was seen flying over the  
Presbyterian Girls' College, Glen Osmond, on  
November 9, 1950, and it was being chased  
by six White-backed Magpies.—F. Harvey.
