*FIELD GUIDE TO THE WADERS* (by H. T. Condon and A. R. McGill).—A publication of the Bird Observers Club of Victoria. This small book is a first-class aid to field studies of a very difficult group of birds—the Waders or Shorebirds, of the Order Laro-Limicolae. The book appears to have been designed as much for beginners as for the more experienced observer. Contents include a brief classification of the families, useful hints for identification, condensed descriptions of the birds, their habits and distribution, a glossary of terms, quick-reference index of common names and a series of illustrations by Mr. Condon of every species in flight or at rest. There is also an Appendix of *Possible Future Additions*. The book, 36 pages, is in its second (revised) edition. It is well produced, entirely free from printer's errors, and may be obtained at the amazingly low price of 2/6 (plus 5d. postage), from Mr. F.
