bird alight three times in the same spot, among eggs of Crested Terns (*Sterna bergii*). I searched without success for eggs or chicks that I could attribute to the species. Later, a film showing diagnostic features of the bird was shown at a meeting of the Adelaide Ornithologists Club. This is the second locality record for the State: for the first—on Baudin Rocks, near Robe—see Dr. J. M. Bonnin's article in the *Ornithologist* of 1968 (vol. 25, pp. 18, 24). According to Dr. Bonnin, the species was found to be breeding on Baudin Rocks in two successive summers, in 1967-8 and 1968-9. He himself saw a single bird, in the same place, on 2 January this year, but found no breeding evidence.
