

JABIRU KILLED BY POWER LINE—
My wife and I visited Darwin in November 1971. In the *S.A. Ornithologist* of June 1970 (p. 157), there is mention that fourteen jabiru were seen at the Fogg Dam by those visiting the Territory in 1967—with five dead birds, killed by striking a power line. We saw three jabiru, and one dead one under the power line. We were concerned about this, and about the earlier observation, and we made representations in the appropriate quarter. The power line has now been removed. I write not only to let members know that this has been done but also to suggest that people often react in the right way if the position has been explained to them carefully. SIR HENRY SOMERSET.
