

BIRD NOTES

BIRDS OF THE INVESTIGATOR GROUP WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO FLINDERS ISLAND — An inspection of Flinders Island, South Australia, was made from June 25-30, 1974. Two new species were added to the list prepared by Eckert J., 1968 Birds of the Investigator Group, S. Aust. Orn., vol. 25, part 7, 201-205. These were Double-banded Dotterel *Charadrius bicinctus*, 30 birds clearly seen by P. Macrow at the extreme southern end of the Island, and Chestnut Teal *Anas castanea*, 4 birds clearly seen by L. Delroy on the lake on the north-west side of the Island. Confirmation of the presence of the Sacred Kingfisher *Halcyon sanctus* on the Island was made by L. Delroy who saw one bird approximately 2 km due north of the airstrip on the side of the road leading to the northern house (unstreaked crown noted). — L. DELROY.
