

## Bird Notes.

SEPTEMBER.

At Netherby.—The Willie-Wagtails began singing at night on 9th inst., and evidently the female birds are now on the nests.

Young of the Magpie and Yellow-tailed Tit-Warbler were seen since 22nd inst.

The Pallid Cuckoo, Narrow-billed Bronze Cuckoo, Black-chinned Honey-eater, and Yellow-breasted Shrike-Tit are still about here.

Adelaide.—I heard a Greenfinch singing in the trees in Victoria Square near the G.P.O. at 1.20 p.m. on 28th inst.

The following birds, etc., were seen on various trips since last meeting:—

Australian Mountain Thrush (*Oreocincla lunulata*), at National Park, Belair, on 30th ult.

Spotted Ground-Bird (*Cinclosoma punctatum*), near National Park, Belair, on 4th inst.

Spotted Scrub Wren (*Sericornis maculata*), at the Sturt River, Upper Sturt, on 1st inst.

Black-winged Bell Magpie (*Strepera melanoptera*), beyond Mylor, on 16th inst.

Reed Warbler (*Acrocephalus australis*), at a dam beyond Mylor on same date; at Kinchina on 23rd inst.

Striped Honey-eater (*Plectorhyncha lanceolata*).

White-shouldered Caterpillar-eater (*Campephaga tricolor*).

Rufous Song-Lark (*Cinclorhamphus mathewsi*).

Shy Grouse-Wren (*Hylacola cauta*).

Purple-backed Wren-Warbler (*Malurus assimilis*).

Magpies, White-browed Babblers, and Red-capped Robins were nesting, and in a nest of the last named there were two Robin's eggs and one egg of the Narrow-billed Bronze Cuckoo.
